#### Mission

Respect Mother Earth with gender equity, promoting agro-ecology and the rescue of native and creole seeds to build food sovereignty and good living for the families in the Achí region.

#### Vision

To achieve the sustainability of the organization by rescuing the ancestral knowledge for producing and using native and creole seeds for the well-being of families in the communities. So that they can produce their own food and generate income in harmony with Mother Earth.

#### Values

#### **Cultural Preservation**

We rescue and preserve knowledge that is part of our Mayan Achi culture. In order to transmit the knowledge to new generations, we raise awareness through the training of young people about the importance of preserving our cultural practices.

#### Holistic Health

At Qachuu Aloom, through our practices we promote physical, emotional, and social well-being. Through healthy eating we help with having a healthy body, and we also carry out activities to strengthen our emotional and social needs.



#### **Spirituality**

Our ancestors taught us about the connection between our Maya spirituality and mother earth. We honor this through ceremonies, respect for the elements of nature including seeds and all living things. We respect the spiritual beliefs of each person who participates with us. We are guided by the Mayan calendar and the phases of the moon to make decisions that impact our lives, and Mother Earth.

#### Equity

We give our best effort to achieve our objectives, by overcoming difficulties. We keep in mind our vision and mission as motivation.

#### Perseverance

In the organization we promote gender and social equity and equality of rights. We believe that both men and women should have the same opportunities and rights.



#### Solidarity Economy

We promote practices that weave collaboration and creativity to strengthen our local economy.

#### Respect for Mother Earth

We recognize that Mother Earth is very important because she has a great biodiversity and therefore we must take care of her through our practices.

This year, we purchased more than 9,500 pounds of native and creole seeds. Through this, we support local women farmers' economy, preserve our native seeds, and share knowledge with other communities.

- Preparation of tinctures, syrup and ointments made from medicinal plants
- Governance and political training workshops





#### HOLISTIC HEALTH

**18 mother** guides strengthened their knowledge in healthy eating, medicinal plants, local governance and political education workshops.

A total of 102 workshops replications were carried out in 18 communities.

# STRENGTHENING THE KNOWLEDGE OF MIDWIVES IN THE MAYA-ACHI REGION

Reinforcement in the topics of medicinal plants with 23 midwives.

4 exchanges between midwives were held to strengthen their knowledge in natural medicine.

Inter community markets are open spaces available to motivate women producers to undertake entrepreneurship. They utilize ancestral gastronomy knowledge while preparing different dishes with the produce from their gardens.

# PRODUCTIVE PROJECTS CARRIED OUT BY WOMEN FROM DIFFERENT MAYAN-ACHI COMMUNITIES



I group of women trained to be food providers in the National School Feeding Program, providing food to 69 children in the community of Panacal de Rabinal, Baja Verapaz.



# PRODUCTION PROJECT

Vegetables production project, formed by 6 women and 1 man from the community of Pichec, Rabinal, Baja Verapaz, producing a diversity of herbs by using agroecological practices.



#### POULTRY PROJECT

6 Women from the community of Panacal, Rabinal, Baja Verapaz, implemented the production of criollo eggs in their farm.



### PROCESSING OF MEDICINAL PLANT PRODUCTS

Encouraging the use of medicinal plants by producing tinctures, oils, soaps and creams; 23 midwives produce medicinal products.



#### **ACCESS TO EDUCATION**

Currently there are 8 women and 1 man from different communities with financial scholarships to continue their education.
